Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope that you have had a good week this week. Half term seems to have come around so quickly, however, having spoken to the children I know that many of them are very much looking forward to having some time with their families at home, or maybe even away! St Edmund's Enters the Open Coding Competition

St Edmund's Junior School are pleased to announce an entry into a national coding competition, for children in Key Stage 3 who are interested in developing an app for charity. After half term, we will be running a coding club for children in Forms 7 & 8 who wish to develop their coding skills and/or enter the competition. To enter, pupils will form groups of 4 and design, develop and test an app for a charity of their choice. The app must inform a wider audience of the charity's goals and/or raise awareness for the charity. A fantastic real world opportunity for children of all levels of confidence and skill to be involved in designing and developing an app. Before the final in June, club members will submit their apps to a panel of St Edmund's judges, (yet to be decided and kept top secret so that no bribing with tuck can take place) who will decide on the final group that will go before judges at the University of Surrey. We look forward to sharing more as the year progresses.
