The Dragonflies have embraced the new school year with gusto! We have started our topic "Turrets and Tiaras" by creating our own Coat of Arms. The children worked carefully, showing their favourite hobbies, animals and family, selecting the colours thoughtfully with reference to the traditional heraldic colours. We read "The Sword in the Stone" and discussed whether it was fiction or non-fiction; the story inspired us to make our own cardboard swords - and the children performed a very well behaved, <u>slow-motion</u> sword fight!

Our Mathematics focused on ordering 2 digit numbers and the class used their skills to create an enormous 100 square - the children cleverly spotting patterns made by the tens and units. In English, we shared our scrapbooks and then wrote about our holidays; we made sure we impressed Mrs Sherwin by remembering our capital letters and full stops. Well done clever Dragonflies!

It has been wonderful to welcome the Crickets back after the summer holidays and hear about their adventures. The children have happily come up the stairs and are beginning to show how organised and independent they can be by hanging up their bags and putting snack bags and reading books away. They began by agreeing class rules and talked about reasons why they needed these rules in the classroom and playground.

In maths, they have been ordering numbers and finding missing numbers. They have explored Numicon and matched it with number cards. By collaborating together, the class sorted out and sequenced cards and had to ask one another questions using the words 'more' and 'less'.

The class have enjoyed hearing and joining in with Nick Sharratt books. They have been predicting words and listening out for rhyming language. Their favourite books seem to be the "Pants" ones and they created a washing line of patterned pants! By using atlases, maps and Google, the class have looked at different countries or places they have visited and begun to hear names of different continents and oceans. A great start to the Michaelmas term!
