Dragonflies

The Dragonflies enjoyed rehearsing and performing their play "The Lonely Scarecrow" for the Pre-Prep Harvest Festival. The children worked really hard on their lines, they made sure they were ready with their cues - and they loved adding actions and facial expressions into their performances. I was so proud of them; well done Dragonflies!

We have been learning about doubling and halving in our maths lessons this week. We are getting very good at doubling 2 digit numbers - by first doubling the tens and then doubling the units and finally adding them together. This 3-step mental arithmetic is very impressive in Year 2 children so early in the school year - clever Dragonflies. We used our maths skills to create our own Doubling and Halving Board Games - the children worked in pairs or groups of three to design a game, adding interesting features such as "booby-traps" and "lift the flap" answers. We used lots of clever calculations to work out both the questions and answers and the children enjoyed the challenge of playing each other's games. What a fun way to learn maths!

Crickets

The Crickets have been finding out about Harvest and learnt a poem about vegetables and where they are grown and they recited this confidently in the Harvest Festival. They observed and talked about a variety of vegetables, which they chopped carefully to make a very tasty soup. Some decided they liked the French bread more than the soup! But Mrs Exley and Miss Culver were impressed with the result. During our Outdoor Learning session all the children were delighted to see the beautiful chickens, fluffy rabbits and hold the very well behaved guinea pigs in the Junior school garden. In writing, the class recounted their trip to Canterbury. Using photos, a map and time connectives, they sequenced their sentences aloud and wrote them. They are beginning to recognise upper case letters to begin their sentences. In maths, the children have sequenced and read the days of the week and the events they do on those days. They have also been exploring 'more than' and 'less than' numbers. In their topic work, the children have investigated a wide variety of toys. They sorted them according to the materials they were made from and how they are work. By playing with the toys, the children were able to recognise different forces used to make them move. They are also designing and making toys using a range of materials and joining techniques.

Honey Bees

The Honey Bees had so enjoyed their topic work finding out about snails last week therefore we decided to continue investigating these minibeasts for a further week.

The children have been busy learning about the different parts of the snail, have made fabulous rolled paper snails for a class display and then took on the role of the snail from Julia Donaldson's The Snail and the Whale and wrote about where they would like the whale to take them. Some very exciting adventures were written! From visiting dinosaurs, going to meet the mermaids and then to venturing to France to taste the wonderful food! The children were set the task to paint spirals and their own detailed snail pictures and their work has been wonderful. The Honey Bees have worked so hard to learn their poem about pollinating bees for the Harvest festival and I think you will agree that they did a magnificent job. As a finale we ended the week by cooking cheesy spiral snacks - very yummy!

In Maths we have continued our work on identifying different parts of the day and have also been learning how to recognise o'clock times.

Forest School was another wonderful session. We decided to transfer our knowledge about minibeasts into producing some land art using natural materials. The children had great fun working in pairs to produce some wonderful Forest School minibeasts; including an enormous spider! Well done Honey Bees.

Ladybirds

The Ladybirds started the week with some farmyard mark making, which included painting with tractors and farm animals. We had some great conversations about the different patterns the wheels made, comparing them to the markings that the animals made. We have also been washing the farmyard animals with soapy water, sponges and tooth brushes and talking about how we keep ourselves clean!

We have been talking about our feelings a lot this week and we have been playing a game called the 'feelings farmyard'. We took turns to roll the dice, then move our counter along the animals who were presenting different emotions. When it was our turn, we had to determine how the animal felt and what makes us feel the same way.

We had great fun during our outdoor learning session this week; collecting leaves and exploring our shadows. We talked about leaves changing colour in autumn and we then collected as many 'autumn' leaves we could find, brought them back to the classroom and created a collage with them! Our Edmund Bear Hunt took us to the Chapel on Wednesday, where we had the opportunity to look at the food that was being collected for the harvest festival. On Thursday, we then had our Harvest Festival and the Ladybirds sung their 'Big Red Combine Harvester' song so beautifully. Well done Ladybirds!
