




### Crickets

What an eggs-tra busy week the **Crickets** have had. They started the week bird spotting around the school site. Venturing along to the wooded areas, to see if they could see any birds on their bird spotting sheets. Already they are becoming familiar with the birds and their different features. They have seen starlings, magpies, blackbirds and robins. Good luck with your 'great bird watch' this weekend. The children will collate their findings at school and send them off to the RSPB. In maths, the class have been reading and learning days of the week and talking about what they do and when each day. They have used number lines and games to 'count on' when adding and remembering to put the larger number first.

The children are becoming familiar with different names of continents and learnt how swallows migrate from the UK across Europe and end up in South Africa for winter. The class have printed and painted to recreate the swallow's journey and wrote stories about a swallow called Sparky. On Thursday, Mr Barnes invited us to the Food Tech room to explore an unusual 3D shape that looked like an avocado! It turned out to be an emu egg. Mr Anderson came to help us discover what was inside by using an electrical drill to make holes at either end, as the shell was so hard to crack. Mrs Purnell then blew out the yolk and albumen from inside. It was the equivalent of 12 eggs and filled a bowl! At the end of the week, we made bird food to tempt the birds into our gardens this weekend.









## **Honey Bees**

After the wonderful week we had exploring dinosaurs last week, the **Honey Bees** continued with their dinosaur investigations this week and have spent the week pretending to be palaeontologists! The children have had great fun carefully digging for fossils and dinosaur bones in our excavation tray and have been inspired by seeing and handling real fossils. The huge ammonite fossil encouraged much exploration and it was lovely to see the children undertaking their own research from the non-fiction book table. We then decided to make our own fossils and had fun pressing dinosaur toys into the salt dough we had made before cooking them to harden them off. The idea of discovering dinosaur bones inspired some wonderful artwork and the children made fantastic cotton bud skeleton pictures. The children also designed their own dinosaurs using 2D shapes, carefully thinking about the features the dinosaur would need, and some wonderful factual discussions took place. To finish our work on dinosaurs we thought about the reasons that they became extinct and researched for information, before undertaking our own volcano science experiment to see how many of our toy dinosaurs we could 'wipe out' with the lava flow! We then tried to replicate an asteroid strike in the sand pit with a large ball to see how much damage this might cause! Great fun was had, but we all decided we would not want to have been there if it really happened!

In maths we have spent the week investigating line symmetry with some wonderful 'hands on' activities.

In Forest School we had fun making some clay leaf fossil prints.

This week the **Ladybirds** have started looking at the story of the The Snail and the Whale'. The Ladybirds have been creating their own stories about life under the sea and they have especially loved finding out more about snails. We have been looking at pictures of their shells and creating our own spiral patterns onto snail shells. We spent our outdoor learning session hunting for snails in the school grounds. The ladybirds each took a leaflet about different snail shells to look for during our snail hunt, which was very exciting! They have also made some fabulous snails out of clay, which we will paint next week.

The children have been very fascinated about the different weather we have had over recent weeks, particularly the cold and fog. On Tuesday, they were super excited when I showed them the tray of water I had left out overnight which had frozen. We talked about how the water freezes during the night because it gets so cold, but it soon melts when the sun comes up in the morning.
