


English

The children will follow the National Curriculum Maths using the Abacus Maths scheme. Addition.

Computing


We welcome Form 5 to Computing and ICT by becoming Game Developers. Form 5 will plan and develop a game of their design in a simple blocks-based application.



Form 5 pupils will assume all roles in a game design project from planning and design to creation, debugging and testing. There will even be the opportunity for peer evaluation, i.e. have great fun playing our friends' games. In ICT lessons, Form 5 will further develop their digital skills and creativity using a Word Processing package.

Science

This term our first topic will be Forces. The children will be learning about Sir Isaac Newton, gravity and friction.

French

This term our Form 5 will be learning how to tell the time in French and how to describe their timetable. They will also be learning about French history and they will also learn about the differences between French and English schools.







Music

In music this term we will be be exploring different sounds, rhythm and pitch through a look at music of the Victori-



an Era and a spooky Haunted House project!

We will sing, play instruments, compose our own 'street cries' and generally have fun and make lots of noise! Mr Swatman will also be encouraging children to practise their instruments at home and possibly take an up instrument if pupils don't already play.

PE and Games

During PE this term we will start with a series of fun fitness tests to establish a general level of overall fitness and an understanding of the concepts of health, fitness and wellbeing. We will then be moving on to a carousel of varying sports which may include golf, badminton, games for understanding, basketball, handball lacrosse, fitness and touch rugby.

History and Geography

Our topic this term is the Victorians. The children learn about Queen Victoria and her family, school life, the Great Exhibition and the various jobs children had to do. We will be visiting the Museum of Kent Life on Thursday 10th October - costumes required.





This term the children will be using various map skills and applying them to learn about different regions around the world. The children could bring in postcards or photos of places that they have visited.

Drama

This term we are continuing to develop the children's basic understanding of various dramatic techniques, and how and when to use these



effectively in performance. We will also be building their confidence to perform for their peers and to work outside of their comfort zone, giving them skills transferable to other aspects of their lives. These skills include communication, team work, public speaking and building confidence and creativity.

Religious Studies

This term the children will be studying Islam, paying particular attention to the Five Pillars.
