The Ladybirds have had a wonderful week learning from the award winning book, Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister. The class have thought about what makes a good friend and why it is important to think about others' feelings. Sharing has been an important theme. We have, of course, enjoyed lots of rainbow fish art activities with the children undertaking some fabulous colouring in and creating their own wonderful watercolour rainbow fish along with Brusho work underwater pictures for the rainbow fish to be stuck onto. Some really stunning work. In maths the children have had fun giving the rainbow fish a specific number of pebble bubbles to match a given number, with some children working up to 20. They have also been sorting and sequencing different sized rainbow fish cut outs. The older children have also been using the interactive white board to undertake simple addition work. The younger children have worked hard using tweezers to move pom poms onto a rainbow fish cut out to give it different coloured scales. Great fun but very hard work!

The children are watching carefully for the emergence of the butterflies. As this is being written we have one just about to emerge from its chrysalis... a wonderful learning opportunity for the children.
