# Dragonflies

Last week's work on Elizabeth I inspired such enthusiasm from the Dragonflies that we indulged in researching another famous Tudor - Henry VIII! We used portraits of him to learn about the past, discovering what a valuable source portraits are for all history detectives. We used a selection of collage materials and stick-on jewels to create our own Tudor-style portraits - please visit the classroom and view our "Portrait Gallery".

We are enjoying the story "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" (please don't watch the movie at home before we finish it!) and wrote our own imaginary "through the wardrobe" stories. Many of us are starting to independently use the punctuation we are learning about in our grammar lessons - and Mrs Sherwin was very pleased to see the correct use of capital letters, full stops, exclamation and question marks.

In Maths we are learning how to answer "word problems" - maths set in real-life situations. We are now very good at working out the operation needed to calculate the answer - and can speedy complete problems. Well done!

Mr Baker (Eloise's and Ben's daddy) visited us to talk about the General Election. He told the children all about the importance of democracy and voting. Following the talk, the children wrote their own reports.

This report was written by Niyam:

"Today Mr Baker came to talk to us about the General Election. He told us about three people who want to be Prime Minister, they are Boris Johnson, Jeremy Corbyn and Jo Swinson. The Crickets have been exploring sight this week. They found out about Helen Keller and how she was blind and later went on to teach other blind people how to read. They explored the grounds of the school and looked to see how far they could spot things from the Sheep field. The beautiful views revealed famous landmarks in Canterbury and the children used binoculars to look even further in the distance. Wearing blindfolds, the children paired up to 'guide' one another safely.



In Literacy, the class wrote about things they would like to see. They mixed colours and painted pictures using details. Following drama and books read, the class wrote about opening a box to see something inside it.




# **Honey Bees**

Forest School was chilly this week! We decided to stay warm playing their favourite game, '1,2,3 where are you?' and then light the camp fire to cook popcorn.





We have been learning about the different planets that we would find in space and have been creating our own solar system using mod roc. The Ladybirds watched a video of a real life rocket taking off into space and landing on the moon, which was very interesting! We have been painting our own planets using water colours and circle shapes to help us.
