

This will be done through highlighter pens and a few symbols, which will be communicated to parents after the trial. During this term we will also be looking at our uniform expectations and about acceptable use of mobile phones in Forms 7 and 8, as per the Junior School Handbook.

Thank you so much for your support during this academic year. We are all hugely privileged to work, teach, learn and have fun at St Edmund's. Over the past year, our pupil numbers have continued to grow, and I am delighted to announce that there will be 4 classes in Form 7 next year; a significant number of children want to have our St Edmund's education and I need to be mindful of the class sizes in Form 7, hence the decision (as ratified by Governors) for 4 classes.
