




Physics in Action!

"A busy week of fixtures and finally some beautiful summer sunshine and warmth!

The U15 girls travelled to Dover College on Tuesday afternoon for rounders. A dominant performance led to a 21-7 victory with the triangle of bowler, back stop and 1st post working smoothly. Zoe Rogers and Gabby Scott-Kilvert put in strong bowling performances, with Alisha Davis at backstop and Iona Lester at 1st post.

The L5 girls have played two kwik cricket matches this week, versus King's Rochester and King's Canterbury. The bowled well and score plenty of quick singles. Although both losses, the team are working hard at skill development and continue to improve at a rate of knots in what is still a relatively new sport to them.

Our 1st XI cricketers were back in action and travelled to King's Rochester for a 20-20. It was a stunning afternoon and having had a disappointing outing at Kent College the previous day, they were keen to make amends. St Edmund's won the toss and opted to bowl.

Millard went onto 25 alongside Scott-Kilvert who stepped up to put together a fantastic innings of 62 not out. Jacob Storey was a solid partner too, playing some smooth strokes to the boundary.

This was a very promising team performance finishing at 154-8. We very much look forward to welcoming the 'Old Boys' next week.
