The School is located on the top of St Thomas Hill, commanding impressive views over the City of Canterbury. The Pre-Prep, Junior and Senior Schools share the same site, while the Choristers live within the Precincts of Canterbury Cathedral.

DETAILS ABOUT THE POST

POST & DEPARTMENT

Department

Sport at St Edmund's School develops individual knowledge, skills, and understanding through a variety of activities. The department develops a positive approach to the subject as well as making it challenging and enjoyable. There is a great opportunity to build confidence, develop working relationships, and leadership skills as well as encouraging a sense of responsibility both as an individual and as part of a group.

Facilities

There are extensive on-site sports facilities which include a sports hall, tennis/netball courts, swimming pool, and a wide range of pitches. In addition, we also have use of four squash courts which border our playing fields, and the gym/sports hall at the University of Kent. There is a floodlit Astroturf pitch and a recently opened Health and Fitness Suite.

Staffing

The department comprises seven specialist teachers of Physical Education, led by the Director of Sport. At present, three members of staff are responsible for the delivery of the academic courses, and all staff are responsible for the Physical Education Programme, the Games Programme and many of the cocurricular activities. In order to staff the extensive Games Programme, the interests and expertise of colleagues and external coaches are utilised. Staff teach across the 2-18 age range.

Co-Curricular

Co-curricular activities play an important part in the ethos of the PE department. Games sessions, team practices, matches and clubs are run before and after school. Activities are numerous and varied in what they offer; some are simply for recreation and participation, whilst others concentrate on areas of performance. Teams compete at both local and county level. Players are encouraged to continue their activities outside of school by joining local clubs and entering for County trials. We currently have a number of pupils playing for Kent at various age groups.
