OVERVIEW

We are a 2-18 independent co-educational day and boarding school with over 600 pupils. We foster a family atmosphere, value the individual and offer a wide range of opportunities to pupils, whatever their interests or strengths. In an historic setting overlooking the City of Canterbury, the school is proud to educate the Choristers of Canterbury Cathedral and of the diversity that day and boarding pupils bring. Both academic rigour and co-curricular involvement are encouraged. Pupils are respectful of each other and work together to create a cohesive, inclusive and happy community. The School is located on the top of St Thomas Hill, commanding impressive views over the City of Canterbury. The Pre-Prep, Junior and Senior Schools share the same site, while the Choristers live within the Precincts of Canterbury Cathedral.





OUR ETHOS

Our pupils benefit from a caring and supportive environment, high-calibre teaching and a holistic educational approach that seeks to develop creativity, leadership qualities and original thinking.

A broad academic curriculum and extraordinarily diverse co-curricular programme enable pupils to find their path and grow to 'be all they can be'.

Our small class sizes enable the personalisation of learning so that pupils receive the attention and academic challenge they need to excel.

The fact that we educate children from the age of 2 to 18 underpins the strong family atmosphere and sense of community that pervade the school.

Highly-qualified teachers mean that young people receive inspirational instruction, with vibrant debate and individual attention colouring every classroom.

Pupils develop learning skills through project work and research opportunities such as the Extended Project Qualification and the Durrell Essay. We encourage cross-curricular work to promote original ideas and multi-dimensional thinking.

POST & DEPARTMENT

A highly skilled and creative teacher of Drama is required to join our prestigious Drama department.

St Edmund's has an enviable reputation for its Drama, both in terms of an academic discipline and for productions and events. These include major whole school productions, encompassing a variety of theatrical styles and many other shows and events throughout the year, including the prestigious St Edmund's Festival.

Practical examinations are of the highest standard and are regularly awarded full marks.

Drama has a wide appeal among the pupil body. Auditions for school productions are highly competitive, with pupils accepting places at renowned drama schools each year.

The department regularly takes pupils to see a variety of theatrical productions at the Marlowe theatre, the West End and further afield on Broadway in NYC.

Department

The school has a 400 seat proscenium arch theatre, which forms part of the Francis Musgrave Performing Arts Centre. It has an unusually large stage area. All technical elements are first rate and are managed by an exceptionally talented stage management team.

The permanent staff consists of the Director and Assistant Director of Drama one full-time teacher and a choreographer, plus one assistant. The Director of Drama shares the teaching of A-level Drama and iGCSE Drama with the Assistant Director of Drama. At Lower Fifth (year 9), Drama is taught as a nonexamined subject and is designed to foster self-confidence and improve communication skills.

The iGCSE Drama course (Cambridge) is followed as an option in the Middle and Upper Fifth years (10 and 11). A-level Drama (Edugas) offers sixth form pupils the opportunity to specialise their skills and several pupils progress to university or to specialist drama schools.

THE ROLE

The successful candidate will be required to:

- Teach A-level, GCSE, Year 9 Drama and, on occasions, Years 7-8.
- Produce school productions, independently or alongside the Director of Drama, such as:
 - Senior School Plays
 - GCSE and A-level practical exams
 - Speech Day
 - Drama lessons
 - Other School events
- Assist Director of Drama to prepare budget quotations for all productions and events.
 - Help design and plot all lighting and sound equipment for drama output including drama lessons, managing pupils to assist in this process where necessary including:
 - Work with the Director of Drama to discuss all lighting and sound requirements, including arranging for the hire of equipment
 - Design and plot lighting for all plays/events
- Embody and model the qualities required to promote excellence and maximise participation in Drama lessons.
- Be available to assist the technical director with stage management of all technical rehearsals/dress rehearsals/performances.
- Teach technical theatre to pupils who opt for these options for their GCSE and A-Level practical exams.
- Run co-curricular Drama clubs.
- Organise local and international theatre trips.
- Where possible, and when required, write/adapt plays for production in Senior School.
- Assist Director of Drama with running master classes for Junior and Senior School Drama scholars.
- As Deputy Licence Holder ensure relevant terms & conditions of the licence from Canterbury City Council are met.
- Responsible for day-to-day Health and Safety in the Theatre including electrical and mechanical
 equipment. Attend School Health and Safety Committee meetings (one per term). Maintain risk
 assessments. Work with Health and Safety Manager to identify outstanding Health and Safety
 risks, take steps to minimize those risks, budget permitting, solve the problems. Take necessary
 training for working at height, construction site safety, first aid etc.
