

Public Examination Results

A Level Results – 2026

- This year's results reflect a strong and broad-based performance across the cohort. Half of all grades achieved were at grade B or above, with the number of B grades holding steady on last year at 28%, and C grades rising from 22% (2025) to 24% (2026) — a sign of solid, consistent achievement across the middle of the grade range.
- At the top end, 22% of grades were A/A, with A* achievement spread impressively widely across the curriculum — spanning Art, Business, Ceramics, Design, History, Maths, Photography, Politics and Psychology, demonstrating real strength and depth across both creative and academic disciplines.
- Notably, 19 of the 60 pupils in U6 — nearly a third of the cohort — achieved at least one A or A* grade, reflecting genuine pockets of excellence throughout the year group.
- The EPQ results were similar to last year with 67% gaining A-B)* or A (2025=75%). All pupils passed.

GCSE Results 2026

- We are delighted with an outstanding set of GCSE results.
- This year's overall 9-4 pass rate is 93% (2025 - 90% our highest in a decade).
- 41% of all grades awarded were 7-9 (2025 – 35% also our highest in a decade).
- 18 pupils achieved an average of 7 or better across all their GCSE subjects.
